Sickle cell disease is a global health problem. In the United States, it is estimated that over 100,000 people have sickle cell disease and that about 2,000 babies are born with the disease each year in America. Sickle cell disease is an inherited disorder that affects red blood cells, oftentimes causing anemia, pain and many other problems.

Under Hartfield's leadership as fundraising committee chair, the committee introduced the SickleTini virtual fundraiser, which paired education with interactive activities and provided new sponsorship opportunities. Hartfield initiated the development of the SCDAA's 50th anniversary campaign creative brief, a marketing tool to steer the strategic fundraising goals. She also served as

a member of the Member Organization Partnership Improvement ad hoc committee, working with the Executive Leadership Council president to develop an approach to member organization benefits, communication and inclusion strategies.

Prior to joining the Sickle Cell Disease Association of America, Hartfield was a manager for federal, state and commercial contracts for **CVP**, an information technology consulting firm in Virginia and Maryland. During her time at CVP, she developed strategic outreach initiatives, wrote strategy and implementation plans for the national expansion of a federal health agency's program and managed a \$30-million disaster recovery grant contract for the state of Tennessee, overseeing staff and operations of CVP's regional office.
